It is highly competitive. Only 700 students in Canada are accepted. Because **HORNEPAYNE**, **WHITE RIVER**, and **MANITOUWADGE** is all involved in the NWMO learn more process we have a slight advantage to getting one of our students accepted with the help of the NWMO as they are a sponsor of the SHAD program.*

- *They can learn about Nanotechnology or Forensic DNA and use leading edge software. They could explore a genetic workshop or a graphics lab, tour a high tech firm, listen to guest speakers like astronomers, world famous mountaineers, or the CEO of a major corporation. There is also fun activities like yoga, ultimate Frisbee, swing dancing, or attend an impromptu musical jam session, and depending on the host campus you can comb the local beach, whale watch, or munch on s'mores at a campsite nearby. The students July is packed from morning til night not just 9am-3pm.*

- *SHAD 2017 will take place from **July 2-28 2017**.*
