  - NWMO Aboriginal engagement team agreements in place with two first nations groups and are meeting with them to discuss potential borehole locations. Key first nation group is proposing an agreement with the NWMO this week. Working with another first nation group (broader area) to re-engage in the learn more process. Working with metis in the region about the potential locations, three organization within the region all engaged. Staff will be attending mining conference hosted by one of the area first nation groups. Continuing work of the agreement with the treaty organization within the region. Provincially working with 2 of the 4 aboriginal organizations, and 2 national organizations.
