### NWMO Report to Committee on Recent Activity

- Nwmo supported the Curling Bonspiel event. The Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) program was able to assist the Hornepayne Minor Hockey Association.

- Dry Storage Dates Presented with the possibility of touring the Oakville NWMO Research Facility and McMaster Research Reactor

- Communications update-Patrick Dolcetti
  - Annual Report 2017 sent to Ministry of Natural Resources
  - NWMO Corporate Newsletter
  - NWMO hosted representatives from 11 countries who are members of the International Association for Environmentally Safe Disposal for Radioactive Material (EDRAM)
- Aboriginal Engagement update-Bob Watts (absent)-Kevin Muloin reports;
  - NWMO Aboriginal engagement team has been active in the North of Superior areas and there are agreements in place with two first nations groups and are meeting with them to discuss potential borehole locations. Key first nation group is proposing an agreement with the NWMO this week. Working with another first nation group (broader area) to re-engage in the Learn more process. Working with metis in the region about the potential locations, three organization within the region all engaged. Staff attended a mining conference hosted by one of the area first nation groups. Continuing work of the agreement with the treaty organization within the region. Provincially working with 2 of the 4 aboriginal organizations, and 2 national organizations.

Presentation of “International Cooperation and Experience” by Jennifer McKelvie, Ph.D., P.Geo. Senior Scientist, NWMO

- Collaboration
  - Signed Seven (7) Cooperation Agreements with Finland, Sweden, France, Japan, United Kingdom, Switzerland, and South Korea
- Experience
  - Research Demonstrations and Projects include; Sweden – Aspo Hard Rock Laboratory, Switzerland – Mont Terri Project, Greenland Analog Project.
  - Switzerland (Granite) Grimsel Underground Research Laboratory with the Material Corrosion Test (MaCoTe). Materials proposed for the DGR such as copper is packed into bentonite clay pucks and put at the same depth as the suggested repository in a borehole and then retrieved in different intervals years later to examine and test for corrosion by multiple international partners to collaborate consistent findings.

Presentation of “Initial Borehole Drilling to Advance Learning-Update” by Jo-Ann Facella, Director of Community Well Being, Assessment and Dialogue, NWMO

- Purpose-to provide an update on conversations with people in the area about plans for potential borehole drilling.
  - Current plan is to initiative borehole drilling in either Manitouwadge or Hornepayne area. Engagement with First Nation and Metis communities are ongoing and consultation has not yet begun. Late 2018 or early 2019 is an estimate for borehole studies to occur.
  - Ongoing Engagement continues with; Hornepayne residents, First Nation and Metis communities in the area, camp owners, trappers, cottagers, bear management/bait fish areas, forestry, and tourism/outfitters.



### Learning More About Canada's Plan for the Long-Term Management of Used Nuclear Fuel

- Questions NWMO are hearing:
  - Purpose of borehole drilling
  - How is the environment protected
  - Is there impact on my property value or my current activities
  - General questions about the fuel, the project the process, the regulatory oversight and how decisions will be made.
  - Perspectives include general support for the economic development and services it could bring Hornepayne but also some opposition.
- Conversations include:
  - Discussion of detailed activities that will be undertaken to protect the environment and minimize temporary effect on current land use near borehole drill location.
  - NWMO commitment with working with those affected to ensure any effects of the studies are mitigated and to return area to original use once studies are completed.
  - Information on Canadas Plan, the project, the milestones, the site selection process and status, the purpose of drilling and activities involved, along with regulatory review and oversight.
- Next steps are to continue information sharing and engagement.
  - Should the decision to move forward in Hornepayne with an initial borehole the NWMO will begin the process of seeking permissions from government and initiate formal consultation with indigenous communities.
  - Identify potential drillers
  - Environmental mapping in the area to establish baseline conditions.
