NWMO Report to Committee on Recent Activity

- Mr. Sandberg provided information on the three (3) significant activities currently being undertaken.

1. Environmental Characterization
2. Request for Proposals for borehole drilling
3. Request for Permission to Drill Submitted to the Ministry of Natural Resources & Forestry (MNRF)

Mr. Sandberg informed the Committee and members of the Public that all 3 activities are still in process. He explained that once updates are available, they will be shared with the Committee.

- Provided information on the Ontario Power Generation (OPG) Tour which occurred on October 21st – October 24th. Mr. Sandberg informed the Committee and members of the Public in attendance that participants had the opportunity of visiting the dry storage facility in Pickering, the NWMO Oakville Research and



Development facility, McMaster University Research Reactor and the NWMO office in Toronto. Mr. Sandberg informed the Committee and members of the Public in attendance that this Tour is open to any member of the public to attend and is strictly based on interest and Tour availability.

- Provided update on the letters to groups and organizations in the Community. Mr. Sandberg explained to the Committee that these letters were sent to groups and organizations in the community to have NWMO staff present at one of their meetings. The intent of these presentations will be for information sharing and to provide an update on the project at hand. Mr. Sandberg further explained that some organizations have responded back to these letters expressing their interest in a presentation and he is looking forward to working with the NWCLC Project Manager in accommodating the different schedules of the groups/organizations to facilitate the delivery of these presentations.

A Question and Answer period took place during which Committee members and members of the Public had the opportunity to ask Mr. Sandberg questions on the Municipal update.

Indigenous Engagement Update – Kevin Muloin

- NWMO continues to meet with four (4) Indigenous communities to discuss the borehole locations in the North of Superior region.
 - Constance Lake First Nation
 - Chapleau Cree First Nation
 - Missisnabie Cree First Nation
 - Metis Nation of Ontario
- Mr. Muloin informed the Committee that the NWMO Indigenous team recently met with Constance Lake First Nation and attended a meeting to broaden engagement opportunities in that area. They will be traveling again next week to make presentation at the High School in Constance Lake First nation as well as to meet with the Elders. Mr. Muloin informed the Committee and members of the Public that the High School students at the Constance Lake First Nation will be traveling to Toronto in the last week of November where they will attend the Learn More center. This will be a great opportunity for the students to interact with NWMO Staff and learn more about the project.
- Mr. Muloin informed the Committee and members of the Public that the Missisnabie Cree First Nation just received land for their reserve this summer. However, since their Community is disbursed around the province, NWMO has attended meetings with their band members in Sault Ste. Marie and Thunder Bay and will be attending another meeting in Sudbury and finally in Toronto all with the intent to reach out to all their Communities.



- The Metis Nation of Ontario recently presented a proposal for an agreement with NWMO and this proposal is currently with the NWMO for final approval. Mr. Muloin informed the Committee and members of the Public that he anticipates this agreement will be approved and a meeting set up before the end of the year.
- Provided information on training provided to the Community Liaison persons from Constance Lake First Nation, Chapleau Cree First Nation and Missisnabie Cree First Nation. Mr. Muloin explained that the training was successful and he hopes this training helps create opportunities for further engagement in these three (3) Communities.

A Question and Answer period took place during which Committee members and members of the Public had the opportunity to ask Mr. Muloin questions on the Indigenous update.
