- Blair Skinner, Mayor of Pinawa, MB – PowerPoint Presentation
Population 1500 Pinawa only exists because of the nuclear industry which came to and developed the site in 1963. Some of the research that was done in Pinawa was the precursor of the current nuclear waste management plan being implemented by NWMO (adaptive phased management). In Pinawa the reactor is five stories below the above ground buildings. Two thirds of the 11,000 acres initially allocated to the project never had nuclear activity on it. The current facilities are slated for decommissioning completion in 2024. There are currently 350 employees working in/at the facilities. The local school receives part of its funding from the nuclear industry. They have a 17 bed hospital. Pinawa is the sight of the first Manitoba hydro damn before seven sisters and the ruins still exist and are a tourist attraction for the town. The entire region is quite comfortable with being a nuclear facility. Their presence for the last 54 years has been a positive impact for community. Everyone including the outlying communities and the First Nation communities want to see a positive future outcome for Pinawa community including future nuclear development of such ideas as SMR (Small Modular Reactors). Mayor Blair Skinner invited members of the Ignace Community Nuclear Liaison Committee to come to Pinawa.
